RIGHT STUFF

Understanding what items are accepted through the Bulky Waste collection will ensure you 'get it right'.

Some items don't belong on the kerbside and cannot be placed out for collection. These are items that may be dangerous for pedestrians or children, damage our environment, or catch fire or explode.

- NO paint, asbestos, chemicals or medicines
- **NO** fuel or oil (or items containing fuel or oil)
- NO batteries or gas bottles
- NO smoke detectors or fire extinguishers

These 'problem waste' items are also not allowed in your kerbside bins, but can be dropped off for free all year at your nearest Waste Management Centre.

NO MATTRESSES, drop off for free instead

Wire spring mattresses and bed bases cannot be placed out for collection, but can be dropped off for free at your nearest Waste Management Centre while the Bulky Waste collection is taking place in your area (limit of two mattresses, or one mattress and one bed base).

UNSURE ABOUT AN ITEM?

Check with us before placing waste out. Visit our website or call 1300 290 763.



Tyres are not accepted during Bulky Waste, so consider repurposing them instead.

RIGHT SORT

Sort the items you're intending to place out for collection into two separate piles:

- Metal and whitegoods (doors removed) these items will be recycled and diverted from landfill
- General and electronic waste items in this pile will be sent to landfill so consider other disposal options first, especially if in reasonable condition / working order

RIGHT SIZE

For safety, there are limits on the volume and types of waste we can accept:

- Your total load must fit into a standard 7' x 4' box trailer, around 2.1m x 1.2m in area
- Individual items must be manageable for our collection crews and cannot weigh more than 30kg

RIGHT PLACE

Think about where you'll place your two individual waste piles before you start taking items out.

- Position them on the kerb where you place your red and yellow bins
- Ensure they don't obstruct footpaths, roads or driveways
- If you live in a rural area and use a common collection point for your red and yellow bins, our trucks can't access your individual property - your bulky waste piles must be placed at the common collection point



BULKY WASTE 2024 YOUR GUIDE TO GETTING IT RIGHT

Make sure the items you place out during this year's Bulky Waste are collected, not rejected, by following a few simple rules.



RIGHT TIME

Our Bulky Waste collection covers close to 50,000 households in 195 localities, and takes around 4 months from start to finish, weather permitting.

That's why it's important to put your waste out on the date specified for your location - no earlier:

- Otherwise our streets will be lined with piles of waste for months
- And you could be fined for illegal dumping

FIND OUT WHEN BULKY WASTE IS COMING YOUR WAY

Collections are broken down by geographic area.

Check the list opposite for your location and the date your collection will take place.
